



# **A Message From Pastor Andy**

Dear JPC family and friends,

As you have probably heard by now, I am having open-heart surgery on June 13 at Froedert to replace my aortic valve and a section of my aorta. This surgery is not an emergency—I have been followed by a cardiologist for this condition the past few years—but it is time-sensitive and must be done. The JPC session met on May 21 to discuss and approve a plan developed by the personnel committee for my absence. I want to fill the whole congregation in on a few of the plan details (specifically the coverages).

I will be on short-term disability leave following the surgery for eight weeks. The Rev. Joyce Rich has graciously agreed to lead worship and preach June 15-August 3. This includes leading communion on July 6 and August 3. I want to offer a big thank you to Joyce for being willing to serve the whole time. (If you are unfamiliar with Joyce, she has been singing in the choir the past year after retiring as a United Methodist pastor.)

In case of emergencies, pastoral care, etc., everyone is to contact one of three people: Bruce Parker at the church office, or one of the Deacon co-moderators, Thea Ragatz and Deb Bennett. Those three individuals have a list of four local pastors who are willing to make visits, lead funerals, etc. They will reach out to find pastoral care for whomever needs it. (We have four different pastors lined up as we are heading into summer and a common time for vacations.) Deb and Thea also now have access to the prayer chain text platform, so reach out to them with prayer requests.

As for my care, my sister Amy will be coming into town for the surgery and staying for four or five weeks. If all goes to plan, I will be in Froedert close to a week, then home for in-home care followed by cardiac rehab. Cards and prayers are appreciated during my recovery. Please note that under short-term disability regulations I am not able to return phone calls or check email.

I will miss not being at the Chicken BBQ, but I hope to be back healthy for the Art Fair and Book Sale. If you have any questions about the plan for my absence, you can ask me (before June 13) or either of the personnel committee co-chairs: Cindy Barder and Sue Snyder.

The following are some of the business items discussed at the May 14, 2025, session meeting (hybrid Zoom/in person).


#### May 14 motions:

- To approve the minutes of April 9, 2025, session meeting.
   Approved.
- To approve the minutes of the Special Congregation meeting on May 11, 2025. **Approved.**
- To hire Ethan's Lawn Service to mow the church grounds.
   Approved.

#### May 14 other business:

- Jerry Gapinski resigned from the Session.
  - The Financial Review committee will proceed with three members this year rather than the usual group of four.
  - There was a major sewer backup in the building that required an extensive and expensive clean out.
  - Starting in June, John's Disposal will provide two dumpsters for trash and recycling disposal. This will be a less expensive option and has some additional benefits.
  - A new Sunday school teacher for the younger students will be needed next fall.
  - Art Fair Scholarship winners are Kaja Chow, Sadie Groskreutz and Ryan Keller.
  - Graduate and Teacher Appreciation will be June 8.
  - Plans for the Chicken BBQ (June 21) are in place.
  - JPC did not send a commissioner to the May 13th Presbytery Gathering.
     The nominating committee will reconvene to find a replacement for Session and Deacons.

Next session meeting is scheduled for June 11, 2025.



#### A Hope Center Update

Two deacons made a visit to the HOPE Center recently to hear first hand how well our efforts are matching with the program needs there. We began with the meal program and discovered how important clients find the coffee service throughout the day. JPC can help by providing 5lb cans of coffee, 2 lb. jars of dry creamer and sugar to supplement their supply. The breakfasts JPC provide on the first Thursday of every month are very popular because they offer a change from the usual fare. Another church may be partnering with us to aid in this mission. There are usually 50 - 60 portions needed of a hot dish, bakery and fruit as well as juice and milk so check the sign up sheets for opportunities to help out.

The deacons were also taken through the Clothes Closet where we found out there is an on-going need for men's clothing in larger sizes. Dress clothing for clients to prepare for job interviews is always needed. Socks and underwear for men and women are welcome also. This new building is equipped with showers that clients can use as needed. Gently used or new bath towels to be used in the shower area would be appreciated. So we will be collecting them at the back of the church. Also provided is a chance to do laundry at the center. Clients bring in their laundry and have it cleaned and dried by the staff. We will be collecting laundry detergent to help out.

In conclusion, JPC will be now collecting coffee supplies, clothing needed, bath towels and laundry detergent on a regular basis. Your cooperation is most welcome and will be put to good use for people in need.
