

Sunday School Recap with Jane Bauer

Handing off the young people you have been working with for the past several years is definitely bitter sweet. You start with "Adam...who is he?" and you work your way through "I think what (whoever) did was really dumb" to "I read from my Bible everyday." (Okay, not everyone does that!)

You become a part of the personal lives of the young people you serve and so, of course, continue to be interested in what they are doing. You also hope that you had some positive impact on their learning about what the Christian faith is all about and whether they are moved to believe what you present.

This year the older KIAs worked their way through the account of Jesus' life and ministry as recorded in the Book of Matthew, the beginning of the church in parts of Acts and what the beliefs of Presbyterians are.

A big part of the program has been centered on giving. Yes, we have recorded what things the group members have done to share their time and talents. Everyone has participated in the worship service in some way, whether collecting offering or performing the role of liturgist or even entertaining with seasonal plays, works of art or piano playing. The most consistent role they have played in giving is in their selection of charities they have wished to support and to utilize Sunday School offerings, congregation support, and the rebates they have gotten from Sentry. The final two contributions of \$150 for

this past six months have gone to Mercy Ships which brings surgeries to people all over the world who would not be able to have access to them otherwise, and to the International Fund for Animal Welfare (IFAW) which rescues, releases and finds other ways to promote the safety of animals everywhere.

I would like to share a few words from each of these organizations in giving thanks to our young people for their support:




