A Letter From Pastor Andy

Dear JPC family and friends,

A few weeks ago I was asked a question by a member regarding our congregation's sense of evangelism and who is responsible for recruiting new members.

"Everyone is," was my response and we had a brief conversation about how we welcome people on Sunday mornings. Following the conversation I was left pondering the question, *is that what evangelism truly is?* The end of the gospel of Matthew tells us to go and make disciples. That's evangelism. But what does that mean in the context of Waukesha County, Wisconsin, and Jerusalem Presbyterian Church?

A few days later I saw a reel on Facebook that fits with these questions. In the video an ELCA pastor, Paul Drees, is answering a question about bringing people to Jesus, and helping them, explaining that these two different tasks—bringing to Jesus and helping—are the same thing: "Jesus never made people come to him. He fed people and healed them. They came to him because he was doing good things. They trusted him first. And then he preached to them."

Last Sunday, elder Bruce Tammi spoke before worship about giving and how the mission committee wants to allocate the rest of its budget for 2025 to support outreach in our community and world. JPC is involved hands-on in a few important outreach activities as well, through both the work of the deacons and the mission committee. Along with Bruce's question of whom to give financial resources to, we are looking to rekindle hands-on mission and outreach and are looking for suggestions.






Pizza Party Supports Journey Garden



Let's come together as a church family to make their holiday season unforgettable! Whether you choose to shop solo, team up with a friend, or involve your small group, every gift makes a difference.


Here's how you can help:

Ernie Glenn Toy Store Drive


